SITUATION:

I need a text list of all the files in a particular folder

SOLUTION:

There's a pretty simple way to do this, but it involves an interface you may not be used to.

Here's an example:

Let's say you want a list of all the files in a folder called myFolder on your desktop.

- 1. Click Start or Microsoft globe icon (on lower left)
- 2. Type **cmd** and press [enter]
 - You will get what is called a "Command prompt".
- 3. Type cd desktop
 - That will change the location ("change directory") to your desktop
- 4. Type **cd** myFolder
- 5. Type **dir** /**b**>myList.txt
 - Important: There must be a space after dir
- 6. That will put a text file called myList inside myFolder which lists all the files in myFolder

Options:

- If you want all the details of each file: dir >myList.txt
- If you want all the files including those in subfolders: dir /s>myList.txt
- To see other options type: help dir
