SITUATION:		

What's this "Format Painter" do?

It's the little icon that looks like a paint brush 💉 Format Painter

SOLUTION:

It can be helpful if you have:

- text that is formatted the way you want (let's call it "good")
- and other text that you want to be formatted that same way (let's call it "bad")

You can Paint this "good" format onto the "bad" text.

I have exaggerated these examples, just to make it clear. But it can be as simple as just the font type or font size or color.

Directions: highlight the "good" text 1. click the Format Painter 2. 3 highlight the "bad" text. good bad becomes good bad Option if you have **multiple** instances of "bad" text: 1. highlight the "good" text 2. click the Format Painter TWICE 3. highlight each "bad" text click the Format Painter again to turn it off. 4. baa good bad becomes good bad had Was this helpful?
