SITUATION:

I need to use a Kyocera, the multi-function machines that print, copy, scan, etc., but it won't work. It says something like "Waste Toner Box is full"

Should I just go ahead and solve that problem myself by emptying out the Waste Toner Box into a nearby trash can?

Oh, and by the way what exactly is "Waste Toner"?

SOLUTION:

Think of Toner as the "ink" used to print your documents.

The "Waste Toner" is any of that "ink" that doesn't properly bond to the paper.

But it's contaminated now and can't be used, so it goes into an "internal trash can" – which is called the "Waste Toner Box"

Each print job produces very little waste toner, but it does add up over time, and occasionally this "internal trash can" (i.e., the "Waste Toner Box") has to be replaced. It can't just be emptied.

So, please do NOT try to solve this situation yourself. That will just cause a mess and it won't actually help since the machine doesn't know that you've emptied it.
