### QUESTION:

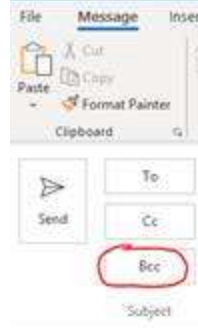
How do I email to a group of people without everyone being able to see who else I'm emailing to?

I'd want to do this for...

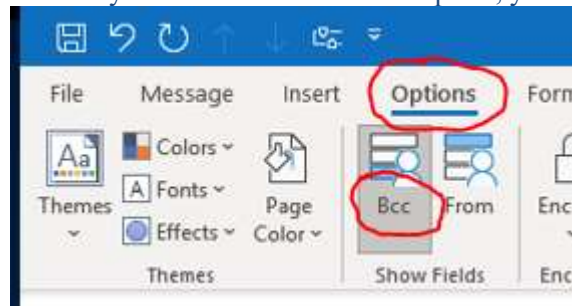
- privacy purposes, or
- to avoid having people "reply all" (which can be annoying to an entire group of people who won't want to see everyone's replies), or
- just to save space (make it less cluttered), when someone receives the email.

### ANSWER:

You will want to use the "Bcc" field. That stands for "Blind Carbon Copy."



Note: If you don't see "Bcc" as an option, you can make it appear this way:
