SITUATION/OUESTION:


When I try and attach a document to my Outlook, it isn't going into the bar below the subject line, but in the body of the email. Any suggestions?

SOLUTION/ANSWER:

If you are replying to an email and the email is not HTML format, then the attachment will go into the body. If you are composing a new email and that is happening, then the email format has been changed from HTML.

In other words:

- If you want the attachment attached, this needs to be "As HTML"
- If you want the attachment **embedded** (in the body of the email), this needs to be "As Rich Text"
